Vague and impractical laws make all of us culprits

- In developed countries you are given a border
 within which you need to operate. Violation amounts when you cross the border
- In India you are asked to walk on a straight line. No one can walk on a straight line, making all guilty in one way or the other
- This gives the enforcement agencies a free hand to pick whom so ever he wishes
- Giving enormous scope for the enforcement agencies to exercise their power
- Resulting into thriving of extortionary corruption

Entanglement in Land Registration for Industrial Use

- Any land sale by a farmer for industry (even if for full value & free needs to be taken from Deputy District Collector (DDC) for converting Agriculture land to Non Agriculture Land
- Ideally it should take 7 days, but generally in our country it takes
 6-7 months if you follow the corrupt system
- The approval from DDC once received is valid for 6 months only
- After the DDC approval is received NOC is required from various departments, viz:
 - Gram Panchayat
 - Taluka Panchayat
 - Mamlatdar
 - State Electricty Board

- State Water Infrastructure
- District Industrial Commissioner
- Office of DILR/SLR
- State Pollution Control Board

Labour Law – some impracticality

- Industries in Gujarat and Maharashtra employ a large pool of migrant workers from Eastern India
- These workers have a tendency of working for 9-10 months in a year and take extended leave for around 3 months to be with family in native village
- They generally leave without family at the place of work and want to do maximum earning in those months
- But the factory act does not allow industries to employ more than 48 hours in a week and not more than 50 hours of overtime in a quarter
- Thus legally speaking, continuous process industries who have a perennial worker shortage cannot have workers work for extra hours and also workers willing to earn more cannot put in extra hours and enjoy extended leave

Real Estate The REAL Story is BLACK within

- Black Money in Real Estate can vanish overnight
 - Exemption of Capital Gains Tax
 - Reduction in stamp duty to 1%

No Incentive for Black Money involvement

Overall gains by removing Black Money from Real Estate deals is much more than the notional loss due to zero capital gains tax & lower stamp duty

Don't compel people to be corrupt, rather encourage them to be participatory




The problem may be that Corrupt politicians & Officers may find it hard to park their black money elsewhere

The Effect of Enforced Compliance

"Rule of law has been replaced by rule of men"

The Raid Raj

The Raid Culture: An International Perspective

- There are no tax raids in developed nations like Australia, US or UK
- Taxpayers are not treated like terrorists/drug peddlers.
- Govt's assumption on voluntary payment of right amount of taxes is appreciable and result oriented
- Hence, the tax compliance level is much higher as compared to us
- Successful because of the fact that there is certainty of strict punishment for the defaulters unlike a freeway for those with pockets full of black money.

Non-compliable provisions in most revenue legislations.....


- Lead to all being defaulters differing only in scale
- Big evaders can afford to buy the system out
- While genuine ones are unable to match the payout of tax evaders to keep the officials happy
- Leading to even the genuine ones turning into evaders in the longer term
